

Measures for the carriage of liquids in cabin (unchecked) baggage

Generally

Pursuant to European Commission regulation no.1546/2006 and AEA (Association of European Airlines) and ACI-Europe (Airports Council International – Europe) regulations, **the carriage of liquids in cabin (unchecked) baggage is prohibited** at all European airports in the EU, Norway, Iceland and Switzerland.

<u>Under the terms of the EC regulation, liquids are</u>:

- \rightarrow Water and other drinks, soups, syrups
- → Perfumes
- → Gels/hair gel and shower gel
- → Pastes/including tooth-paste
- → Creams, solutions (e.g., aftershave lotion, oils)
- → Sprays,
- → Preparations in pressurised containers (e.g., shaving foam and similar preparations such as deodorants in such packaging),
- \rightarrow Mixtures of liquids and solids,
- \rightarrow Other items of a similar consistency.



The following exceptions apply to the above regulation, specifying **liquids excluded from the regulation**. These are:

1. Liquids and gels purchased at airport shops, either:

Beyond the airport security screening, or, at the security-restricted area between the passport control and security control at other EU airports or aboard aircraft registered in the EU. In these cases, they have to be placed in a properly-packed and marked bag and labelled with a receipt verifying the origin and carrying information that the passenger purchased it on the day of the flight.

Note: The exception for purchasing liquids and gels at airport shops does not apply to shops at non-EU airports. For this reason, passengers flying from non-EU airports and transferring in Prague should pay special attention. They will not be allowed to carry their liquids and gels over 100 ml into the cabin, they must be carried in checked baggage only.

2. Personal consumption liquids and gels packaged in units up to 100 ml carried in transparent re-sealable bags of a 1-litre volume as a maximum.

Passengers can collect plastic bags in order to keep liquids and gels purchased outside the airport at departure halls and baggage packing positions.

3. Liquids and gels necessary for medical or dietary requirements during the flight (e.g., baby food, medicines, etc.). In these cases, their need must be proved, and upon
